GOOD TRAVEL . . .

Good travel photographs come from good trips and good trips come from good planning. Don't buy a new camera or lens just before going on holiday; test and be familiar with all equipment before leaving. Don't look for the obvious - the panoramas, the strange clothes, all the things that different from back home. Have an eye for details. Remember that you will show your pictures to friends on your return, so try and give them the atmosphere and feel of the place. This is sometimes better done with three or more detail shots, rather than one general picture. It is better to travel with a positive interest in something. Carry a camera at all times; the miniature types are eminently portable. If you miss a shot you'll kick yourself - because you won't forget the image left on your brain.
